• **Moving Matters! Parkville/M.D. Fox Residency:** This spring more than 300 children from Parkville and M.D. Fox elementary schools with JDPP teaching artists developed *Arts Alive!* showcasing the difference the arts make our lives.

A full year residency this year culminated in thirty children being inspired to create and perform 3 shows of their own performance piece entitled *In This School*.

• **Children with Incarcerated Parents (CWIP) Program:** Featuring both in-school and after-school programs, this year will culminate with a performance of *Dreamcatching*—exploring the hopes, fears and dreams in the lives of the children and their parents at Charter Oak Cultural Center in Hartford.

• **Mom & Kids weekend at York Correctional Institution:** A weekend of arts engagement with Moms, their children and their caregivers. This unique opportunity offers the chance to bond and mend relationships—finding artful ways to express important feelings and to stay connected.

• **6th annual Collaborative Arts Residency at York CI:** Working with incarcerated women to create a soulful performance piece exploring gardens as both nurturing and healing places and as a growing and evolving metaphor for life. *The Great Garden* will be performed for more than 500 incarcerated women, staff and guests this July.
